We've implemented **Central Office** comments to help make communication in the waiver approval process smoother.

Users with the Diversity Office, Diversity Office Director, Academic Personnel, and Academic Personnel Director roles

can leave comments on a waiver request that are only visible to a user with those specific roles.

Analysts and other users will not be able to view central office comments, and these comments will not be included in the waiver PDF.



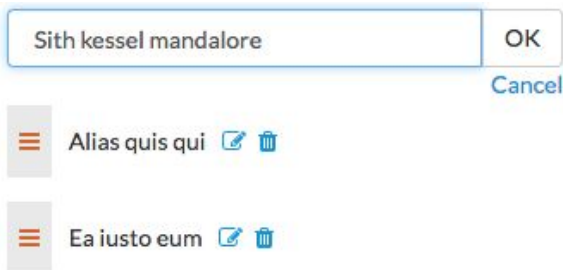

We made a change to the specializations modal to clarify that edits to an existing specialization title are not yet saved. When editing a specialization, the field **button will display OK**, as opposed to the previous vague EDIT button.
