

Recruit Release Notes Changes Launching 2016-07-28

Recruitments

We've **updated the Availability Data for the 2016 - 2017 academic year**. Newly created recruitments will now utilize the latest availability data from NORC and AAMC.






Some campuses pointed out that adding a long list of specializations was a time consuming process. In order to make the addition of specialization lists faster, we developed a feature to allow analysts to **cut and paste whole lists of specializations**.

Each list item will now be added as an individual specialization for applicants to self-select.

UCANR

Development continues for the Exemptions project, which was spun off of the Search Waivers project.

We have now added Exemption Categories to the creation wizard, which should help analysts justify why they require an exemption. These categories are not yet finalized, and will be confirmed at a later date. Analysts can also now add Additional Details, including additional information about the candidate and position, as well as department comments.

We also **added an Exemptions Data API**, complete with <u>exemptions data API</u> <u>documentation</u> on the Recruit website.

Bugs 'n Stuff

- We made some changes in the backend to emails. All of Recruit's "no reply" emails will now come from ap-no-reply@academic-recruit.org in order to avoid being marked as spam. Replies to system emails will still go to the person who sent the email, in the cases where a human sender exists.
- In an effort to clean up and clarify our online help documentation, we removed the FAQ section of the help page and moved relevant articles to their appropriate pages.
- We fixed a backend email issue with the comments section of approvals. Recruit will now no longer attempt to send emails when the comments field is blank.
- Recruit User Managers are again able to properly add user roles in Recruit.
- Addressed an issue where the user role manager would not let you see all the roles for users who had more than 50 roles. Thanks for finding this one, UCSD!
